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## Internship Overview

The New York Speech Coaching Internship Program is an opportunity for aspiring speech coaches and those interested in learning about the field to receive training from experienced instructors, garner experience as coaches and speakers, and assist New York Speech Coaching's administrative and educational staff in day-to-day operations. Participants of the program will receive constructive feedback regarding their progress through observations and discussions with NYSC staff. Interns will interact with other participants of the program, engaging in collaborative projects and joint lessons. Program participants will also take part in the administrative and business related aspects of NYSC. The internship program will last for a period of 12 weeks but is flexible depending on credit requirements. Interns can expect to spend 15 hours per week onsite at NYSC while participating in the program. Some remote work may be required.

*The internship program is 12 weeks and will include:*

### **Lessons with NYSC Instructors (1-2 hours per week)**

- Interns will receive lessons both as a group and individually:
  - Group master classes will be taught weekly by a rotation of NYSC instructors.
  - Additionally, interns will receive two private lessons with the Head of Interns.

### **Group Days / Individual Days**

- The internship will include two 6-hour "group" days per week, when all interns will be on-site simultaneously.
- The internship will include one 3-hour "individual" day per week.

### **Educational / Administrative Work**

- Interns will gain exposure to the educational aspects of speech coaching, including core competencies of speech, anatomy and physiology of the speech mechanism, and the philosophy of speech coaching.
- Interns will gain exposure to the operational aspects of the speech coaching business, including collaborative meetings with instructors and office staff.
